Investment Objective

The Fund provides exposure to global credit markets and aims to generate income with some potential for capital growth over the medium to long term.

Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Global Income Fund had a total return (after fees) of 0.26% in the month of June, underperforming the benchmark (50% Bloomberg AusBond Bank Bill Index, 50% Bloomberg AusBond Composite Index) after fees by 0.06%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.32% for the month, remaining flat against the benchmark.

June was a challenging month where US dollar strength - stemming from rising rates - most impacted Emerging Markets where bonds and credit spreads sold off. Once again, US macro-economic data was generally buoyant in the US, with the U3 unemployment dropping to 3.8%, the lowest rate since the Vietnam Draft era in the 1969. The Federal Reserve hiked for the 2nd time this year (as expected) with the next hike likely in September (84.9%).

The top performing contributors to performance included Global Syndicated Loans, Investment Grade Credit and Global High Yield; whilst the bottom performing contributors included European Convertibles, Collateralised Loan Obligations and Domestic Hybrids.

The "Double Barrel Year" continues to be both an interesting and challenging market to navigate for traditional assets and the knock-on impacts felt abroad in Emerging Markets continue to keep us concerned. Our outlook for global credit markets remains cautiously optimistic even as we begin to wind-down our short rates position. We expect that the improving macroeconomic environment in the US will continue to be supportive of credit markets and bearish for most bond markets, and potentially even for Equities.

The Fund remains long credit and short interest rate risk primarily in the short-end of the US and European curve. We continue to focus on credit sectors and individual securities that offer higher than average credit spreads, favourable structures and improving credit quality. As we head further through this cycle we will look to improve credit quality and slowly increase duration.

¹⁰ Bentham intends to achieve the distribution rate for FY2018 with taxable income. If there is a shortfall of taxable income, the distribution may possibly include a capital return. The current distribution rate setting was based on the running yield of the Fund as at 30 June 2017 and assumes the Fund continues to achieve an equivalent yield for FY2018. Actual distributions, however, can differ from this setting because of future matters which are not known or able to be presently identified.





Portfolio Asset Allocation


