Investment Objective

The Fund provides exposure to global credit markets and aims to generate income with some potential for capital growth over the medium to long term.

Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Global Income Fund had a total return (after fees) of 0.07% in the month of October, underperforming the benchmark (50% Bloomberg AusBond Bank Bill Index, 50% Bloomberg AusBond Composite Index) after fees by 0.25%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.13% for the month, underperforming the benchmark by 0.19%.

October was challenging for markets. Australian Equities returned -6.05%, global equities (unhedged) were slightly better at -5.34% but were not offset by Global Bond which returned a negative -0.05%. Worries about rising interest rates in the US and mid-terms and further trade-war concerns weighed on markets, in particular on the tech heavy equity indexes (influence by the FAANG's Facebook -10.06%, Amazon -20.6%, Apple -2.7%, Netflix -20% and Google -9.9%, versus S&P 500 -6.94%).

The top performing contributors to performance included Collateralised Loan Obligations (CLO), Asset Backed Securities (ABS) and Residential Mortgage Backed Securities (RMBS); whilst the bottom performing contributors included Global Syndicated Loans, Bank Capital Securities and Equity Securities.

Months like October, where Equities and Government Bonds both selloff, question the validity of the barbell approach. We continue to favour floating rate assets for this reason. Our outlook for global credit markets remains cautiously optimistic even as we continue to wind-down our short rates position towards neutral. We expect that the improving macroeconomic environment in the US will continue to be supportive of credit markets and bearish for most bond markets, and potentially even for equities as was demonstrated in October. Our more defensive posture (67% IG) was rewarded in October and we expect to continue to take risk off the table and to reallocate as markets selloff in line with our relative value style. Markets now anticipate the 4th hike of 2018 to be in December (75.3% priced in).

The current distribution rate setting was based on the running yield of the Fund as at 30 June 2018 and assumes the Fund continues to achieve an equivalent yield for FY2019. Actual distributions, however, can differ from this setting because of future matters which are not known or able to be presently identified.





Credit Rating Breakdown




