

Bentham Global Income Fund NZD

Investment Objective

The Fund provides exposure to global credit markets and aims to generate income with some potential for capital growth over the medium to long term.

Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Global Income Fund NZD had a total return (after fees) of 0.50% in the month of November, outperforming the benchmark (50% Bloomberg AusBond Bank Bill Index (hedged to NZD), 50% Bloomberg AusBond Composite Index (hedged to NZD)) by 0.04%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.57% for the month, outperforming the benchmark by 0.11%.

Investor sentiment remained upbeat in November amid continued hopes of progress towards a US/China trade deal and a moderately better outlook for the US economy. Most global government bond yields rose (sold off delivering a negative return), while credit risk premiums tightened (delivering a positive return). Australian government bonds, were an exception, rallying out of step with global markets (closing with an index yield of 1.11%). The rally followed a speech on unconventional monetary policy (UMP) from RBA Governor Lowe specifying a 0.25% lower bound for the cash rate and a preference to buy government and semi government in the secondary market if UMP was needed in Australia.

The top contributors to performance included Global Syndicated Loans, Bank Capital Securities and Collateralised Loan Obligations (CLO); whilst the bottom performing contributors included Global High Yield, European Convertibles and Global Hybrids.

Going forward, we expect credit market returns to continue to be supported by sound corporate fundamentals, with defaults remaining low. As government bond yields have fallen, credit spreads will provide an increasingly important contribution to achieving a positive real yield. Credit spreads should benefit from further monetary easing globally extending the business cycle.

¹⁰ Bentham intends to achieve the distribution rate for FY2020 with taxable income. If there is a shortfall of taxable income, the distribution may possibly include a capital return. The current distribution rate setting was based on the running yield of the Fund as at 30 June 2019 and assumes the Fund continues to achieve an equivalent yield for FY2020. Actual distributions, however, can differ from this setting because of future matters which are not known or able to be presently identified.

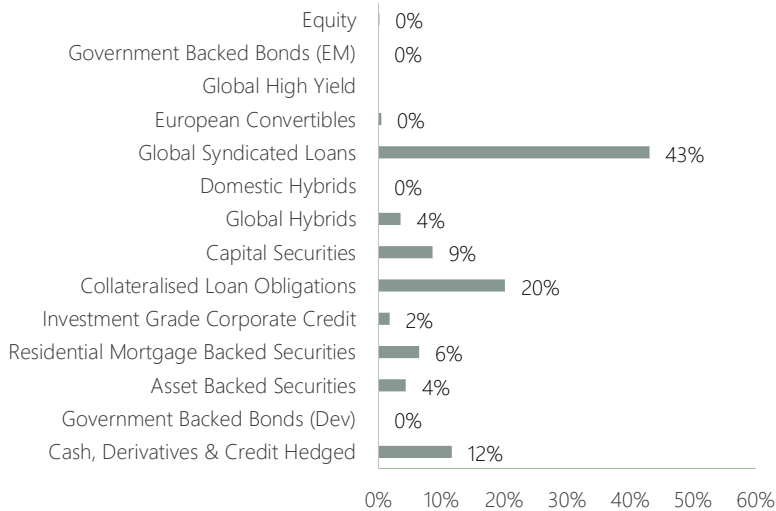

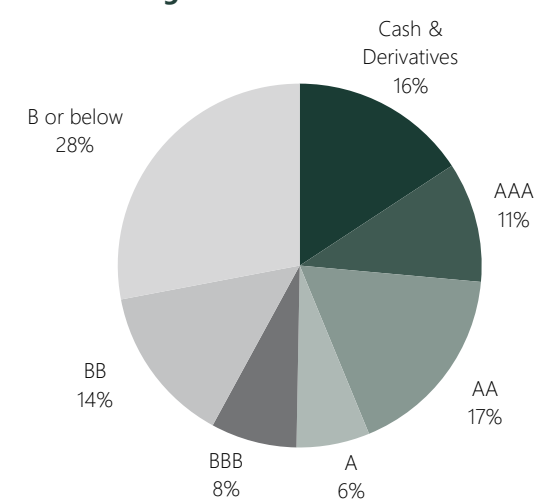

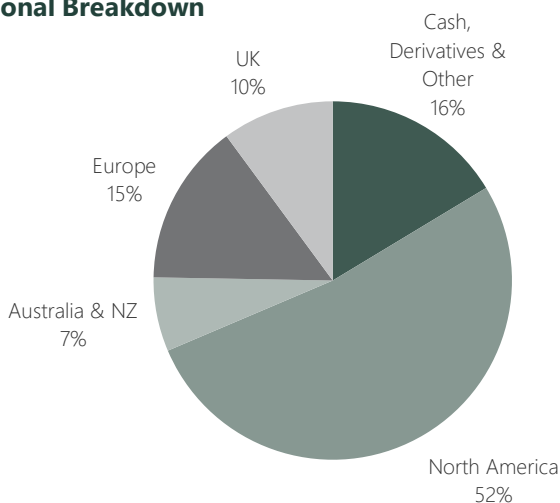
Portfolio Asset Allocation
