#### **Fund Aim**

To provide investors with a diversified exposure to the US high yield bond market with active allocation between individual securities and industries.

#### **Portfolio and Market Returns**

The Bentham High Yield Fund had a total return (after fees) of -13.99% in the month of March, underperforming the benchmark ICE BofAML US Cash Pay High Yield Constrained Index3 (hedged into AUD) by 1.57%. On a before fees basis the fund returned -13.64% for the month, underperforming the benchmark by 1.22%.

#### **High Yield Market**

For the month, none of the 23 industries had positive returns. The top performing industries in March were Food And Drug, Cable/Wireless Video and Wireless Communications with returns (sector performance in USD terms) of -2.52%, -4.29% and -4.31% respectively. The worst performing industries were Energy, Gaming/Leisure and Retail with returns of -34.81%, -17.39% and -15.55% respectively.

The credit yield spread for the Index increased by 368 bps during the month to 873 bps.

#### **Portfolio Exposures**

The Fund's three largest industry exposures are 9.5% in Buildings and Real Estate, 8.5% in Chemicals, Plastics and Rubber and 8.4% in Broadcasting and Entertainment. The Fund's top three company exposures are 1.9% in Bausch Health, 1.5% in BBA Aviation and 1.4% in Solera. During the month, the Fund increased its exposure to GFL Environmental, Unisys and Pioneer Energy Services; with decreased exposures to LPL, PQ and Sensata Technologies.








#### **Portfolio Asset Allocation**



#### **Regional Breakdown**




#### **High Yield Spread to Worst (bps)**
