The Fund provides exposure to global credit markets and aims to generate income with some potential for capital growth over the medium to long term.

Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Global Income Fund had a total return (after fees) of 0.43% in the month of September, underperforming the benchmark (50% Bloomberg AusBond Bank Bill Index, 50% Bloomberg AusBond Composite Index) by 0.11%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.42% for the month, underperforming the benchmark by 0.12%.

The month of September saw the first monthly sell-off in Equity market since March with most credit spreads marginally wider with the notable exception of loans (our largest exposure). Globally, the risk remains for another COVID-related shut down in the Northern Hemisphere as temperatures cool and infection rates rise. A number of countries are firmly in a second wave of COVID, albeit with a lesser death-toll to date

The top contributors to performance included Global Syndicated Loans, Collateralised Loan Obligations (CLO) and Investment Grade Credit; whilst the bottom performing contributors included Bank Capital Securities, Global Hybrids and Equity Securities.

There is a surprisingly high level of confidence given the economic backdrop. Countries around the world are now implementing their own strategies to get back to normal, while dealing with second wave of Covid infections. While research has seen positive developments in vaccine testing, anti-viral and more effective indirect therapies, it is the extraordinary Fiscal and Monetary policy which was rapidly deployed that is bridging the activity deficit We are now 21 days from the US election which has the potential to surprise markets again and potentially remains a risk should neither candidate win with a clear mandate.

Actual distributions, however, can differ from this setting because of future matters which are not known or able to be presently identified.




Portfolio Asset Allocation
