Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham High Yield Fund had a total return (after fees) of 0.46% in the month of March, outperforming the benchmark ICE BofAML US Cash Pay High Yield Constrained Index3 (hedged into AUD) by 0.31%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.50% for the month, outperforming the benchmark by 0.35%.

High Yield Market

For the month, 18 of the 23 industries had positive returns. The top performing industries in March were Aerospace, Telecommunications and Service with returns (sector performance in USD terms) of 2.03%, 1.43% and 1.34% respectively. The worst performing industries were Utility, Food/Tobacco and Wireless Communications with returns of -0.98%, -0.31% and -0.18% respectively.

The credit yield spread for the Index decreased by 22 bps during the month to 331 bps.

Portfolio Exposures

The Fund's three largest industry exposures are 9.0% in Diversified/Conglomerate Service, 9.0% in Electronics and 8.3% in Healthcare, Education and Childcare. The Fund's top three company exposures are 1.2% in Trimas, 1.1% in Altice Financing and 1.0% in Radiology Partners. During the month, the Fund increased its exposure to TriMas, Hyland Software and Synaptics; with decreased exposures to KAR Auction Services, Laredo Petroleum and Cleveland-Cliffs.






Portfolio Asset Allocation



Regional Breakdown




High Yield Spread to Worst (bps)
