Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Syndicated Loan Fund NZD had a total return (after fees) of 0.63% in the month of April, outperforming the benchmark (Credit Suisse Leveraged Loan Index hedged into NZD) by 0.12%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.70% for the month, outperforming the benchmark by 0.19%.

Fund Statistics

Active return (after fees)2

At month end, the Fund had a yield to maturity of 5.15% and running yield of 4.50%, with the credit yield spread increasing by 7 bps to 407 bps during the month. The Fund had an interest rate duration of 1.36 years and credit duration of 4.11 years.

Leveraged Loan Market

The discount margin (3 year) for the Index remained flat at 449 bps.

The top performing leveraged loan industries in April were Consumer Durables, Energy and Aerospace with returns (sector performance in USD terms) of 1.26%, 1.08% and 1.08% respectively. The worst performing loan industries were Utility, Housing and Financial with returns of 0.07%, 0.22% and 0.24% respectively.

Portfolio Exposures

The Fund's three largest industry exposures are 12.1% in Healthcare, Education and Childcare, 10.8% in Electronics and 7.2% in Chemicals, Plastics and Rubber. The Fund's top three company exposures are 0.9% in Burger King, 0.8% in Finastra and 0.8% in Numericable. During the month, the Fund increased its exposure to Jazz Pharmaceuticals, Cable One and Corelogic; with decreased exposures to Southern Graphics, TransDigm and Axalta Coating Systems.


