Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Global Income Fund had a total return (after fees) of 0.05% in the month of June, underperforming the benchmark (50% Bloomberg AusBond Bank Bill Index, 50% Bloomberg AusBond Composite Index) by 0.30%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.13% for the month, underperforming the benchmark by 0.22%.

June was a slightly positive end to a strong Financial Year 2021. Equities, Credit and Bonds rallied on the back of more vaccine optimism in the US which continues to open. The Federal Reserve's (Fed) rate-setting meeting brought no change to policy, but its projections indicated that interest rate rises could come in 2023. This seemed to wrong-foot some market participants, though subsequent comments by Fed officials sought to allay any worries over tightening monetary policy too quickly. Overall, the economic picture remained rosy. Q1 GDP grew at 6.4% (quarter-on-quarter, annualised), which was modestly lower than the consensus of 6.7%.

The top contributors to performance included Bank Capital Securities, Investment Grade Credit and Global Syndicated Loans; whilst the bottom performing contributors included Bond, Asset Backed Securities (ABS) and Residential Mortgage Backed Securities (RMBS).

The credit market outlook remains favourable, particularly floating rate markets with the potential to benefit from rising interest rates and higher inflation should it continue. The macro environment remain supportive; with vaccination rates rising which will allow activity to increase (particularly for Covid-19 afflicted industries such as tourism & travel), consumers have built up savings with pent up demand, and government fiscal policies have become extremely supportive.

Credit spreads (which provide additional yield above cash rates and bond yields) are likely to remain attractive in a low cash rate environment, and with less exposure to the risk of inflation. More broadly, market valuations have been heavily influenced by coordinated monetary and fiscal policy leading to higher asset prices in equities and government bonds.

The current distribution rate setting was based on the running yield of the Fund as at 30 June 2020 and assumes the Fund continues to achieve an equivalent yield for FY2021.

Actual distributions, however, can differ from this setting because of future matters which are not known or able to be presently identified. As such, we have adjusted the distribution rates for the Global Income Fund in March 2021 for the rest of the financial year 2021 upwards from 0.30% to 0.83%.

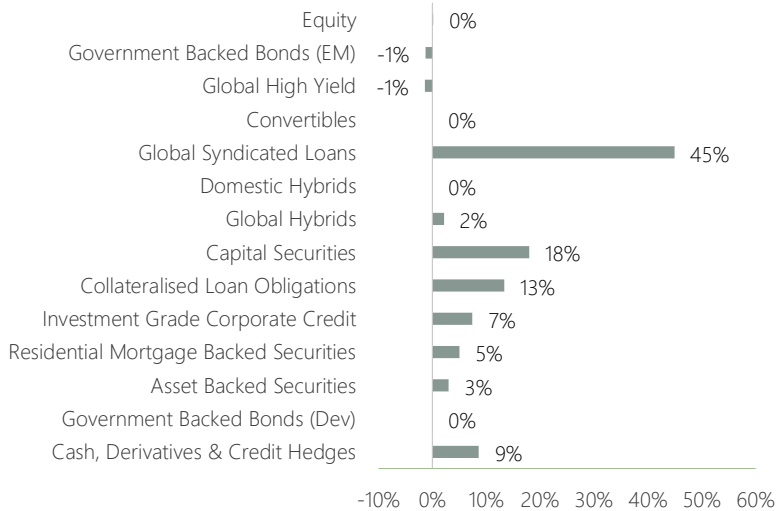
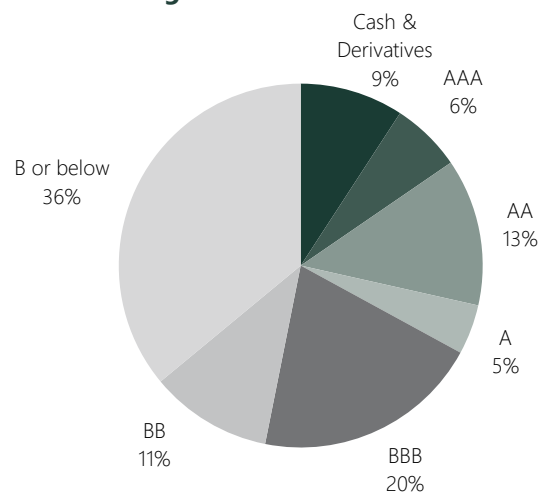
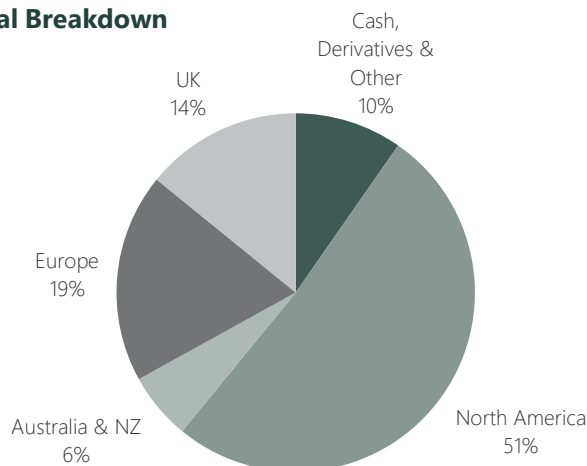
