Fund Aim

To provide diversified exposure to securities across global credit markets, with the flexibility to adapt its credit and cash exposure to suit market conditions across the credit cycle, and deliver consistent levels of income.

Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Global Opportunities Fund had a before fees return of 0.82% for the month, outperforming the benchmark by 0.82%. The top performing contributors to performance included Global Syndicated Loans, European Convertibles and Collateralised Loan Obligations (CLO); whilst the bottom performing contributors included Investment Grade Credit, Bank Capital Securities and Global Hybrids.

Portfolio Asset Allocation

During the month, exposures to Basis Trades, Cash and Equity increased, whilst exposures to Global High Yield, Global Syndicated Loans and Capital Securities decreased. Current asset allocations are 61.3% in Global Syndicated Loans, 11.8% in Global High Yield, 6.7% in Capital Securities, 6.1% in Investment Grade Corporate Credit, 5.5% in Collateralised Loan Obligations, 2.7% in Global Hybrids, 1.6% in Asset Backed Securities, 0.7% in Equity, 0.5% in Residential Mortgage Backed Securities, 0.1% in Convertibles, -4.0% in Government Backed Bonds (EM) and 7.0% in Cash, Derivatives & Credit Hedges.

Portfolio Industry and Issuer Exposures

The Fund's largest industry exposures are: 11.7% in Aerospace and Defense, 10.4% in Electronics and 10.3% in Banking. The Fund's top three company exposures are: 3.1% in Qantas Airways Ltd, 2.9% in Commerzbank AG and 2.0% in Heathrow Funding Ltd.

Leveraged Loan Market

The top performing leveraged loan industries in September were Utility, Metals/Minerals and Energy with returns (sector performance in USD terms) of 1.56%, 1.41% and 1.04% respectively. The worst performing loan industries were Healthcare, Food/Tobacco and Retail with returns of 0.50%, 0.50% and 0.52% respectively.






Portfolio Asset Allocation
