

Bentham Asset Backed Securities Fund

Investment Objective

To provide exposure to investment grade global asset backed securities (ABS) and generate stable income with some capital growth.

Portfolio Returns

The Bentham Asset Backed Securities Fund had a total return (after fees) of 0.06% in the month of December, outperforming the benchmark (Bloomberg AusBond Bank Bill Index) by 0.06%. On a before fees basis the fund returned 0.09% for the month, outperforming the benchmark by 0.09%.

Portfolio Exposures

The Fund's sector allocations are 29.0% in US Broadly Syndicated Collateralised Loan Obligations (CLO), 23.4% in European CLO, 13.2% in UK Residential Mortgage Backed Securities (RMBS), 9.8% in Middle Market CLO, 7.8% in Australian RMBS, 5.6% in Cash & Derivatives, 4.5% in Aircraft ABS, 3.8% in Credit Card ABS, 2.4% in US Commercial Real Estate (CRE), 0.3% in Auto ABS, 0.2% in European RMBS and 0.1% in Personal Loan ABS.

Contributors

The top performing contributors to performance included US Broadly Syndicated CLO and Middle Market CLO; whilst the bottom performing contributors included Aircraft ABS and Australian RMBS.

Outlook

The Fund remains focused on the higher rated tranches of ABS issuance, offering investors a high credit quality, higher yielding, secured alternatives to investment grade corporate and government bonds, with low interest rate risk.

We place a high value on the structural benefits ("terms") typically included in global ABS structures to help preserve the principal of investors in the higher-rated tranches, such as cashflow priority, security, seniority, and reduction in leverage over time.

Bentham intends to achieve the distribution rate for FY2022 with taxable income. If there is a shortfall of taxable income, the distribution may possibly include a capital return.

The current distribution rate setting was based on the running yield of the Fund as at 30 June 2021 and assumes the Fund continues to achieve an equivalent yield for FY2022.






